




Paint Night






Pictionary Night



The induction ceremony for the University of Connecticut chapter of Alpha Lambda Delta took place on Wednesday, March 29th at 6pm at the Jorgensen Auditorium. Freshmen who earned a GPA of 3.5 or greater during their first semester were sent an invitation via email/mail to join this honor society.

The ceremony held was lovely. Students dressed in formal attire and upon entry signed their name in a notebook as their final step of acceptance in ALD.
